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




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Our collaborations abroad are also numerous:



SIPMU AND THE CLINICAL AND SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH ON HYPNOSIS

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PHYSICAL CONSCIOUSNESS vs. SPIRITUAL CONSCIOUSNESS

"Physicist Roger Penrose and neurophysiologist Stuart Hameroff claim that consciousness emerges from quantum-level elements of the brain's cytoskeleton. The cytoskeleton is a protein based structure that maintains the integrity of living cells, including neurons.

The neurons in the brain are organize into a network of microtubules of microscopic size but astronomical number. The network of microtubule is known as "microtrabecular lattice". It could be responsible for the quantum-receptivity of our brain, picking up, transforming, and interpreting information based on phase-conjugate resonance.

But I feel that this is contrary to all religious belief particularly Eastern Philosophy.

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- Penrose-Hameroff Model of Quantum Consciousness deals with physical consciousness. In this model brain receives (quantum -hologram receptivity) information and process them. In this model physical consciousness dominates over spiritual consciousness. The domain of physical consciousness extends up to the region of Brahmn. In English Brahmn means ever expanding. This region was created after the first Big Bang and the universe is expanding ever since.
- Ever expanding means ever changing. Quantum theory can be applied in this region since it deals with probability.
 - Spiritual consciousness deals with Self-Realization.
- In State of Samadhi, when soul transcends for journey into higher spiritual regions brain does not accompany Soul.
- It is the Soul only which realizes Itself.

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- However, brain of the enlightened persons gets the knowledge of this experience simultaneously. It is worth mentioning here that in disembodied spirits (subtle body) there is no brain but they receive information and process them and also sometimes communicate with us.

- And the human entities, in consequence of their comparatively greater spirituality and of high purity of their heart, had no difficulty in getting access at times into the astral planes and holding communion with the departed spirits.
- This yuga was of the longest duration"
 Here again there's no brain in departed spirits and no neural or cortical activity is involved in holding communion into the astral planes. This experience is purely at spiritual level.
- This is the difference in physical consciousness and spiritual consciousness.

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- I would also like to quote few lines from Hidayatnama from Sar Bachan (Poetry) by August Founder of Radhasoami Faith His Holiness Soamij Mahraj:
- "When your eye turns inward in the brain and you see the firmament within, and your spirit leaves the body and rises upward, you will see the Akash in which is located Sahas-dalkanwal, the thousand petals of which perform the various functions pertaining to the three worlds.At the apex of this Akash, there is a passage which is very small like the eye of a needle. Your Surat (spirit) should penetrate this eye.
- Further on, there is Banknal, the crooked path, which goes straight and then downward and again upwards. Beyond this passage comes the second stage.

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- Trikuti (Region having three prominences) is situated here. It is one Lakhi Yojan 2 in length and one Lakh Yojan in width.
- There are numerous varieties of glories and spectacles at that plane which are difficult to describe.
- Thousands of suns and moons look pale in comparison to the light there. All the time, melodious sounds of Ong Ong and Hoo Hoo, and the sounds resembling thunder of clouds, reverberate there.
- On attaining this region, the spirit becomes very happy, and purified and subtle.

From here onward, it becomes cognizant of the spiritual regions. "

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FOR A HUMANISTIC HYPNOTIC PSYCHOTHERAPY

- Every health worker must be able to provide not only the professional support of his speciality but also human accompaniment.
- It is regrettable that too often, we still look at the treatment of the disease and overlook the variables linked to the complexity of the patient's personality.

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- The patient as a person, as an individual with his or her own dignity, is at most helped to overcome the disease of which he or she is the bearer, but little support is given in overcoming his or her fear, while also competently dealing with the overall suffering and anguish of his or her family.
- When a patient comes to us, in addition to the symptoms and signs of a disease, we encounter a universe filled with pain and, sometimes, despair, in the face of which we cannot turn a blind eye and remain aseptic.
- It is necessary to know when and how to provide reassuring assistance, to build a bridge of trust and human solidarity through responses that nourish the hope of being able to change never false hopes, as soothsayers do. How hard it is to build compliance when we are faced with a human being rendered helpless by suffering.
- Bringing more humanity into care, more kindness, more respect, with scrupulousness and a spirit of service, because every man and every woman, with the same clinical diagnosis, suffer inwardly differently. A not inconsiderable weight in the health-patient relationship is carried by the personality of the health professional.



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- In the field of Psychotherapy, for example, success is the outcome of an interactive process of coordination of the epistemological premises and meaning-systems of the patient-therapist dyad. Let us recall here briefly the concept of Durcharbeitung, i.e. that mental work in Hypnotic Psychotherapy which is useful so that certain new connections between present and past problematic situations, between present discomfort and related painful memories, can be broken down and subsequently re-synthesised and made one's own by the patient, since she/he had already glimpsed and mentalised them by the therapist.
- What does a patient expect from Hypnotic Psychotherapy?





- First of all, a conception still persists that is influenced by the semantic stratifications of the culture of belonging due to the sensationalism of pseudo-scientific readings or circus nonsense seen on TV or on the Internet that feed dereistic expectations that are detrimental to the scientific seriousness of the discipline, giving it a 'magical' halo.
- The psychobiological characteristics that make possible the establishment of rapport, the cornerstone of Hypnotic Psychotherapy, are based on a natural phenomenon, species-specific communication, the result of the adaptation of the human species to its social environment.
- Hypnotic phenomena, which can appear to varying degrees between different people (ideomotor phenomena; altered perception; altered memory; altered subjective perception of time, etc.), make Hypnotic Psychotherapy a Clinical Science of the psychobiological changes produced by communication between human beings within a relationship that is therapeutic, and which takes place in a given setting.

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 All types of psychotherapy start from an analysis of demand. It often happens that patients, in search of the longed-for change, have not achieved it with other colleagues; rather, they arrive 'burdened' by as many nosographic labels as there are colleagues who have visited them, conceptions that most of them have internalised so much that they have a pejorative self-image that it is a priority to dismantle, like when as children, we played with Lego bricks.

 This is a process from human being to human being, maintaining neutrality to avoid allying oneself too long with any of the instances of the patient's psychic apparatus, but dancing with her/him according to unpredictable parameters, avoiding violations of the setting.





- Rapport will always be the fundamental tool in Psychotherapy: without sharing, without authentic intersubjectivity, it will not be possible to assign the patient the role of co-author of his own change.
- I like to compare the therapeutic relationship to a compass, the needle of which aims to orientate between Affectivity, Emotions, Values and Growth Goals.
- Subjective suffering can be traced back to emotionalimaginative experiences generated by unconscious processes of knowledge that are not integrated in awareness. Re-establishing integration between the various parts of the Self is the ultimate goal of Psychotherapy, not just hypnotic therapy.



- In an optimal situation, the Hypnotic Psychotherapist closely resembles a great musician, who is able to use pauses, arranging them in the melody; he also resembles a great painter, who is able to distribute the shadows in such a way that certain parts of the scene depicted on the canvas shine.
- When the soft flow of the therapist's words guides the patient's associations, when the therapist's words are formulated taking into account the most concrete and sensory aspects of the patient, what has been sown along the induction can touch the deepest part of the patient, find space, settle and bear fruit. What counts, therefore, in a helping relationship is the quality of acceptance and empathic listening, putting the patient at the centre. Everything else follows.

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
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
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LAYING THE FOUNDATIONS FOR A THEORY OF CONSCIOUSNESS



focuses on the scientific exploration of consciousness by pursuing an interdisciplinary approach at the intersection of theoretical physics, neuroscience and philosophy of mind.

Challenge Our conscious inner life is characterised by subjective experiences that manifest themselves in an enormous variety of phenomenal qualities: the seductive scent of a rose, the taste of a fresh strawberry or the moment of happiness while watching a colourful sunset, to name a few typical examples.

Although no one doubts that the brain is involved in the formation of these phenomenal states, the exact role of the brain in conscious processes is the subject of intense scientific debate among various schools of thought. Many scientists are convinced that the brain creates consciousness from insentient matter, others believe that the brain assembles our familiar macroscopic conscious states from microscopic blocks of consciousness, while still others believe that phenomenal states result from the brain's interaction with an omnipresent field of consciousness.

What unites the various schools, despite their differences, is the challenge of finding an integrated approach to understanding the physical and inner worlds that culminates in a conclusive theory of consciousness.

LAYING THE FOUNDATIONS FOR A THEORY OF CONSCIOUSNESS

One of the major challenges for cognitive neuroscience lies in in deciphering the mechanism behind advanced cognitive processes that culminate in conscious states, with the defining characteristic of consciousness being the presence of phenomenal qualities (qualia). Conscious processes include, on the one hand, stimulus-induced conscious perception, which is directed toward experiencing the external world, and, on the other hand, self-referential mental processes, such as stimulus-independent reasoning and memory retrieval, which are introspective in nature.

The common route to narrowing down the mechanism behind conscious processes is to explore the neural correlates of consciousness (NCC), seeking to isolate the distinctive features of neural activity patterns associated with conscious states. Mounting evidence suggests that conscious states are related to long-range synchronized brain activity, with these activity patterns originating from abrupt changes in macroscopic brain dynamics and reflecting the *collective behavior* of large numbers of neurons. In-depth analyses of the empirical data indicate that pattern formation arises from *phase transitions* and that the dynamical characteristics of the brain are due to criticality.

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Consequently, drawing on the available evidence, a natural strategy to unveil the mechanism behind conscious processes consists in studying the mechanism underlying critical dynamics. Of particular interest in this regard is self-organized criticality, which stands for the ability of a complex system to adjust a control parameter that keeps the system near a critical point of a phase transition. Expressed differently, it can be expected that insight into the mechanism used by the brain to control phase transitions will lead to a deeper understanding of the mechanism by means of which the brain manages to exceed the threshold of consciousness.

To pursue this avenue, methods of theoretical physics are required, since the collected empirical data on its own does not reveal the mechanism behind phase transitions. The most promising methods in this context are those of quantum field theory, which have turned out to be remarkably powerful for the description of collective behavior in many-body systems and the explanation of abrupt phase transitions that result in the formation of synchronized neural activity patterns.





In a new study, based on quantum electrodynamics (QED), the fundamental theory of the electromagnetic interaction, model calculations on brain dynamics have now been performed and the mechanism underlying phase transitions has been investigated in detail

(https://doi.org/10.3389/fnhum.2024.1379191).

The model calculations demonstrate that the initiation of phase transitions and the formation of synchronized activity patterns is due to the resonant coupling of the brain to the ubiquitous vacuum (zero-point) fluctuations of the electromagnetic field, referred to as zero-point field (ZPF).

This omnipresent field, which is represented by a spectrum of normal modes, has a prominent position in the construction plan of the universe and can be interpreted to mean that the vacuum is not a void, but a vibrant sea filled with energy and potentiality. Moreover, the study suggests that the coupling is controlled by modulating the concentration of the most abundant neurotransmitter glutamate. A direct consequence of resonant glutamate-ZPF coupling is the *amplification* of specific ZPF modes, which leads us to conclude that the ZPF is the key to the understanding of consciousness and that the distinctive feature of neurophysiological processes associated with conscious experience consists in modifying the ZPF.





Considering the prominent position of the ZPF in the construction plan of the universe, it seems reasonable to conceive of the ZPF as the fundamental substrate of consciousness.

This idea can be translated into the postulate that the ZPF is inherently sentient, or in other words, that the universe is permeated by a ubiquitous psychophysical field that reveals itself extrinsically through its energetic properties, while intrinsically it is of a phenomenological nature, suggesting that the spectrum of phenomenal qualities is represented by the vibrational spectrum of the ZPF and that each normal mode is associated with an elementary shade of consciousness.

Proceeding from this postulate, the significance of resonant glutamate-ZPF interaction for the formation of conscious states becomes apparent in that the amplification of specific ZPF modes is inextricably linked with the excitation of specific phenomenal qualities. This theory of consciousness, according to which phenomenal states arise through resonant amplification of zero-point modes, is given the acronym TRAZE.



While conventional materialist approaches attribute the emergence of phenomenal states to a mysterious mechanism whose operating principle remains obscure, TRAZE provides a transparent and comprehensible mechanism for the formation of conscious states. The explanatory power of the theory is due to a paradigm shift according to which consciousness is not regarded as a phenomenon that arises from insentient matter, but recognized as the inherent nature of the omnipresent ZPF that can be accessed under suitable conditions. Following the psychophysical field hypothesis, access is restricted to those systems that can couple resonantly to the ZPF and have the capacity to modify the undifferentiated ground state of the ZPF.

Metaphorically speaking, the keyboard of consciousness is built into the ZPF, and the brain produces concrete conscious states by playing chords on this keyboard. The study presents an experimental setup that can be used to test a corollary of the theory, namely, the prediction that normally occurring conscious perceptions are absent under experimental conditions in which resonant glutamate-ZPF coupling is disrupted.


